Welcome to my piano studio at Westside Christian School! We've got a fun year ahead with the theme "Shake, Rattle, Rock, and Roll!"

The Plan

Students will again begin this piano year by attempting to get to the piano for 30 consecutive days. After 30 days of making daily time to practice (see the attached sheet entitled *Roll a Die*), a practice habit should be developing. Since you may have weekend travel plans which could disrupt the 30 days of consecutive practice, please note that a few of the daily activities may take place away from the piano. You may not be near a piano, but your child can still fulfill the 30 day practice requirement by labeling note names or tapping rhythms. *One activity involves taking a video of your child playing an assigned piece, then sending the video to me.* Only one task box per day should be completed, crossed off, and dated. A parent signature is required for prizes to be awarded.

Once this first challenge has been met, students will move on to other practice challenges. Prizes I look forward to awarding this year include shakes donated by Chick-fil-A, maracas, Pop Rocks[®], and wooden dice games.

If your child misses a practice day, encourage your child to try again with a new challenge sheet and a renewed determination to meet the 30-day challenge. It's worth it. **Practice = Progress**.
